An Update in Wilderness Medicine 2010



Overview

Montana Family Medicine Residency is presenting its 2010 biennial 'Update in Wilderness Medicine' on Friday afternoon, June 18th, Saturday afternoon, June 19th and Sunday, June 20th, 2010.

This year, the conference is to be in conjunction with the Montana Academy of Family Physicians' Summer Meeting held Thursday thru Saturday.

Again, we will be gathering at Chico Hot Springs Resort, Pray, Montana between Livingston and Gardiner, MT.

Wilderness Medicine topics will emphasize the rural-wilderness interface experienced by family medicine physician and other practitioners in Montana.

Accreditation

Application for 10.5 hours of prescribed credit is applied for through the American Academy of Family Medicine as well as credit toward Fellowship in the Wilderness Medicine Academy.

Kids Gone Wild

Outdoor 'wild'erness activities are planned to run in conjunction with the conference presentations. These will be geared for kids ages 4 to 13 years old and will be from 1:30pm to 4:30pm both Friday and Saturday afternoon. Cost is \$5 per child per session.

Montana Family Medicine Residency

MFMR was established in 1995 to meet physicians shortages in Montana. The curriculum encompasses full spectrum family medicine and is supervised by Clinical Faculty with the University of Washington School of Medicine.

Each year, the program graduates six Family Medicine physicians, most of whom go to work in rural Montana.

Wilderness Medicine Track

MFMR integrates a Wilderness Medicine Track with residency training in Family Medicine. 'Trackers' take the Wilderness Advanced Life Support (WALS) course, organize our biennial 'Update in Wilderness Medicine', attend a Wilderness Medical Society national conference, complete our three year, longitudinal 'Noon Conference Lecture Series', participate in practical skills workshops and outings as well as pursue clinical and research opportunities on wilderness medicine topics.

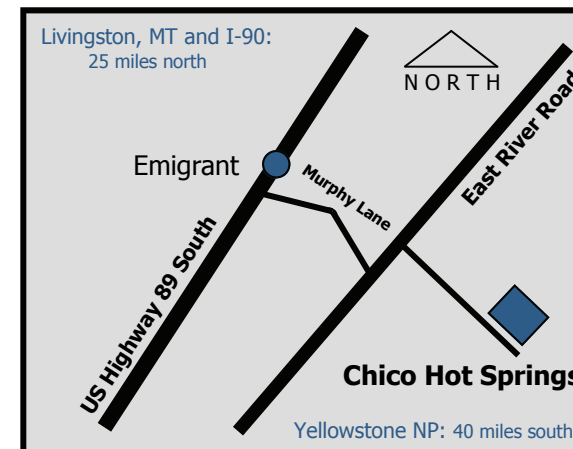
Accommodations
